**NOTICE OF PRIVATE COMPETITIVE BOND SALE**

Telephone (585) 394-4090, Fax (585) 394-4092 or written proposals will be received and considered by the undersigned Treasurer of the Village of Oakfield, Genesee County, New York, at the office of Municipal Solutions, Inc., 2528 State Route 21, Canandaigua, New York on Thursday, May 12, 2011, until 11:30 A.M., (Prevailing Time), at which time and place they will be publicly opened and announced, for the purchase, in Federal Funds, at not less than par and accrued interest of \$237,415 Public Improvement (Serial) Bonds, 2011 (the "Bonds"), dated May 26, 2011, and maturing in the annual principal installments each calendar year on May 15, beginning May 15, 2012, as follows:

The Bonds will be dated May 26, 2011, and are **not** subject to prior redemption, in whole or in part, prior to maturity. The Bonds will bear interest at the rate or rates per annum specified by the successful bidder therefore in accordance herewith, payable on November 15, 2011 and semiannually thereafter on May 15 and November 15 in each year until maturity.

Interest will be calculated on the basis of thirty (30) days to the month and three hundred sixty (360) days to the year. Unless all bids are rejected, the Bonds will be awarded and sold to the bidder complying with terms of this Notice of Private Competitive Bond Sale and offering to purchase the Bonds at the lowest net interest cost. The Village reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and any bid not complying with this Notice of Sale will be rejected.

The record date for the Bonds is the last business day of the calendar month preceding an interest payment date.

The Bonds will be issued in registered form by means of a book-entry-only system with no physical distribution of bond certificates to the public. One Bond certificate for each maturity will be issued to the Depository Trust Company, New York, New York or its nominee ("DTC") and immobilized in its custody.

DTC is an automated depository for securities and clearinghouse for securities transactions, and will be responsible for establishing and maintaining a book-entry system for recording the ownership interests of individual purchasers in the Bonds. Individual purchases of beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds may only be made through book entries (without certificates issued by the Village) made on the books and records of DTC (or a successor depository) and its participants, in denominations of \$5,000 or integral multiples thereof, except for one necessary odd denomination in the year 2012. Principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable by the Village or its agent by wire transfer or in clearinghouse funds to DTC or its nominee as registered owner of the Bonds. Transfer of principal and interest payments to participants of DTC will be the responsibility of DTC; transfer of principal and interest payments to beneficial owners by participants of DTC will be the responsibility of such participants and other nominees of beneficial owners. The Village will not be responsible or liable for payments by DTC to its participants or by DTC participants to beneficial

owners or for maintaining, supervising or reviewing the records maintained by DTC, its participants or persons acting through such participants.

The deposit of the Bonds with DTC under a book-entry system requires the assignment of CUSIP numbers prior to delivery. It shall be the responsibility of the successful bidder to obtain CUSIP numbers for the Bonds prior to delivery and the Village will not be responsible for any delay occasioned by the inability to deposit the Bonds with DTC due to the failure of the successful bidder to obtain such numbers and to supply them to the Village in a timely manner. All expenses in relation to the printing of CUSIP numbers on the Bonds shall be paid for by the Village; provided, however, that the CUSIP Service Bureau charge for the assignment of said numbers shall be the responsibility of and shall be paid for by the successful bidder.

The Bonds will be designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code).

Each proposal must be for all of the Bonds and must state in a multiple of one-hundredth of 1% or a multiple of one-eighth of 1%, the rate or rates of interest per annum which the Bonds are to bear and may state different rates of interest for Bonds maturing in different calendar years; provided, however, that (i) only one rate of interest may be bid for all Bonds maturing in any one calendar year and (ii) variations in rates of interest so bid shall be in ascending progression in order of maturity so that the rate of interest on Bonds maturing in any particular calendar year shall not be less than the rate of interest applicable to Bonds maturing any prior calendar year. Unless all bids are rejected, the award will be made to the bidder complying with the terms of sale and offering to purchase said bonds at such rate or rates of interest as will produce the lowest net interest cost computed in accordance with the net interest cost method of calculation, that being the rate or rates of interest which will produce the least interest cost over the life of the bonds, after accounting for the premium offered, if any. If two or more such bidders offer to purchase the bonds at the same net interest cost, computed as described above, the bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid offers to purchase the bonds at the highest premium dollar amount. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids, and any bid not complying with this Notice of Private Competitive Bond Sale will be rejected. A GOOD FAITH DEPOSIT WILL NOT BE REQUIRED.

Such bonds are issued pursuant to the Constitution and statutes of the State of New York, including among others, the Village Law and the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to two bond resolutions adopted on July 13, 2009 and one bond resolution adopted on July 13, 2009 and amended on July 27, 2009, authorizing (i) the issuance of \$205,534 of serial bonds for the construction of improvements to various Village roads, and (ii) the issuance of \$180,000 of serial bonds for the reconstruction of and construction of improvements to the Village storm sewer system.

The Bonds are general obligations of the Village. There is no limitation, either as to rate or amount, upon *ad valorem* taxes levied upon taxable real property in the Village which may be required to pay the Bonds and the interest thereon. The State Constitution requires the Village to pledge its faith and credit for the payment of the principal of the Bonds and the interest thereon and to make annual appropriations for the amounts required for the payment of such interest and the redemption of the Bonds. The State Constitution also provides that if at any time the appropriating authorities fail to make the required appropriations for the annual debt service on the Bonds and certain other obligations of the Village, a sufficient sum shall be set apart from the first revenues thereafter received and shall be applied for such purposes, and also that the fiscal officer of the Village may be required to set apart and apply such revenues as aforesaid at the suit of any holder of such obligations.

As a condition to the purchaser's obligation to accept delivery of and pay for the Bonds, such purchaser will be furnished, without cost, the following, dated as of the date of the delivery of and payment for said Bonds: (i) a Closing Certificate, constituting a receipt for the Bond proceeds and a signature certificate, which will include a statement that no litigation is pending, or to the knowledge of the signers, threatened affecting the Bonds, (ii) an arbitrage certificate executed on behalf of the Village which will include, among other things, covenants, relating to compliance with the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), with the owners of the Bonds that the Village will, among other things, (a) take all actions on its part necessary to cause interest on the Bonds not to be includable in the gross income of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes, including without limitation, restricting, to the extent necessary, the yield on investments made with the proceeds of the Bonds and investment earnings thereon, making required payments to the Federal Government, if any, and maintaining books and records in a specified manner, where appropriate, and (b) refrain from taking any action which would cause interest on the Bonds to be includable in the gross

income of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes, including, without limitation, refraining from spending the proceeds of the Bonds and investment earnings thereon on certain specified purposes, and (iii) the approving opinion of the law firm of Hodgson Russ LLP, Buffalo, New York to the effect that the Bonds are valid and legally binding general obligations of the Village for which the Village has validly pledged its faith and credit and, unless paid from other sources, all the taxable real property within the Village is subject to the levy of *ad valorem* real estate taxes to pay the Bonds and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

There is no Official Statement which accompanies this Notice of Private Competitive Bond Sale. Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the United States Securities and Exchange Commission does not require the distribution of or offering document in connection with the sale of the municipal securities offered through this notice.

The purchaser shall be obligated to furnish to the Village, when and if requested, prior to the delivery of the Bonds such information requested by the Village as shall be necessary to enable the Village to determine the “issue price” of the Bonds as described in Sections 1273 or 1274 of the Code.

The successful bidder may, at its option, refuse to accept the Bonds if prior to delivery of the Bonds any income tax law shall provide that the interest of such Bonds is taxable, or shall be taxable at a future date for Federal Income tax purposes.

THE VILLAGE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CHANGE THE TIME AND/OR DATE FOR THE OPENING OF BIDS. NOTICE OF ANY SUCH CHANGE SHALL BE PROVIDED NOT LESS THAN ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE TIME SET FORTH ABOVE FOR THE OPENING OF BIDS BY MEANS OF A SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE OF SALE TO BE TRANSMITTED OVER THE TM3.
